1. Compulsory question

Discuss the benefits and disadvantages of natural beekeeping, both for bees and for the wider environment.

- 2. A beekeeper asks you to analyse their honey to describe the floral origin. Explain the practical steps needed to create a microscope slide starting from a jar of honey, requirements for the microscope and the method of identifying pollen grains, including illustrations where appropriate, along with any precautions needed to describe the original nectar sources accurately.
- 3. Discuss the criteria that a judge may use to assess honey on the show bench.
- 4. Describe the life history of a solitary bee as well as a social bee (other than a honey bee). Describe relevant physical differences to honey bees. Compare and contrast their efficiency for pollination.
- 5. Discuss various methods for changing comb.
- 6. Give an account of the work of any four of the following: Eva Crane, Ingrid Williams, Dorothy Hodges, Lesley Goodman, Brenda Ball.
